Past through Present

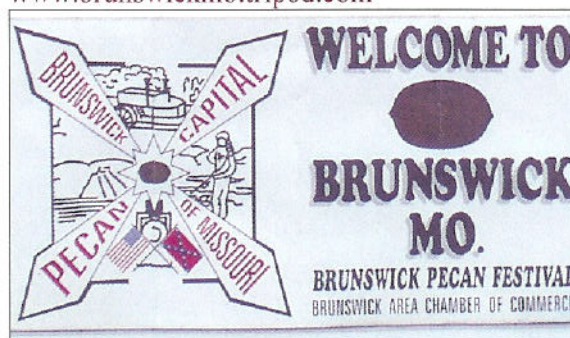
Brunswick, located in Chariton County, MO, was founded in 1836 by James Keyte, a Methodist minister who named the town after the area from which he originated, Brunswick, England, located near Manchester, England. A marker for James Keyte is located in Douglas Masonic Cemetery at the top of the hill on Adams St. The 1838 Keyte home is enclosed within the Hotel Florence's structure. Keytesville, MO, the county seat of Chariton County, was also founded by James Keyte.

Brunswick, at the confluence of the Missouri and Grand Rivers, was an official campsite of the Lewis and Clark Corps of Discovery in 1804. Today a modern marina provides easy access to the Grand River. A familiar sight near this area is a hydrofoil which is presently moored there. A marker at the marina commemorates the Trail of Death traversed by the Potawatomi Tribe.

Brunswick has always been blessed with abundantly rich farmlands. Early settlers attracted to this resource were from Kentucky, Virginia, and the Carolinas. In the 1840's a large influx of German immigrants came to the area. Churches reflective of these nationalities are evident in the town.

Today Brunswick retains a prosperous farming tradition. In more recent years agricultural enterprise has started to reflect a more diverse nature. Brunswick now boasts pecan farms, a Christmas tree farm, and seasonal produce markets. These latter farms also have gift shops that encourage visitors to leisurely browse.
